Josiah Elting's Farm contained 88 acres at the west end of Lot No. 10 in the Southern Division, of the First Tier of the 1760 distribution of patent lands; it also included 90 acres of land on the west side of the road, which was the northern half of the Bouwerie Tract his grandfather and namesake's. The farm parcel is fairly intact with the exception of the addition of a few newer houses and the construction of Route 32 North, which bisects it. A creek crosses the property where a saw mill is said to have operated until 1870. The western 90 acres were conveyed to Josiah's son Charles in the 19th century.

The story-and-a-half stone and brick house is located on the east side of Old Kingston Road. It was built in 1786 and is said to be the first brick house constructed in the town. It faces south and has a symmetrical three-bay front façade with a center entrance flanked by windows. The house has a full front porch with stone columns added some time in the early twentieth century. There is a driveway just north of the house which leads to a barn and other outbuildings located to the northeast of the house. An early 20th-century brick house is located north of the older house, and there is a brick addition to the older house that appears to have been built at the same time; it replaced a wood lean-to shown in a 1902 photograph. [LeFevre, 495.] Two historic barns on the also survive near the main house.

4. SIGNIFICANCE:

According to LeFevre, "Abram's son Josiah married Hester Brodhead and, together with his brother Henry, who did not marry, built, about 1786, the brick house now owned and occupied by Mr. Terpenning, about 2½ miles north of this village and which is by far the oldest brick house in this town. Josiah died in 1813, May 15th, aged 52 years, his wife, Hester, in 1848, at the ripe age of 86 years. Josiah left four sons, Cornelius, Abm. J., Charles and Richard. The last named studied medicine and located in Rondout, where he became a very noted physician. Charles lived on part of the old homestead where his grandson, Watson, lived. Abm. J. lived for a time in the brick house of his father." [p. 494]

Maurice Freer owned the property when the 1865 Agricultural Statistics were taken as part of the New York State Census. Freer is listed as owning 105 acres with a farm valued at \$3,000. In 1873, Freer sold the property to Sylvester Rose for \$6,250. Rose sold the property barely two years later to Eliza and Nelson Terpenning. The Dutch barn on the property burned to the ground in July of 1915. Today, the property contains 20.50 acres of land, a carriage barn and woods. 38.50 acres of orchard are now a separate parcel.

1813	Josiah Elting died; his wife, Hester would live until 1848, probably with her son, Abraham M. Elting, who became the head of the household.

"Mr. Maurice Freer has sold to Sylvester Rose the farm on which he now resides, lying about three miles north of this village. The farm contains 105 ½ acres. Price \$6,250.
Mr. F. contemplates a removal to this village, having purchased of Mr. Edmund Eltinge a lot on Eltinge Avenue on which he will erect a residence. Price paid for the lot, \$575."

- 1877 12 April 1877
 "The farm of Sylvester Rose, formerly owned by Maurice W. Freer, about two miles north of the village, was sold on Tuesday under a second mortgage of \$1000 held by Eliza A. Terpenning. There was a Savings Bank mortgage of \$2,000 ahead of the mortgage under which the place was sold. The property was bought in by the mortgagee for \$3,400, the amount of the two mortgages with interest to date. The place contains 105 acres, and was sold a few years ago for about \$6,000."



HOUSE BUILT BY JOSIAH ELTING-THE OLDEST BRICK HOUSE IN THE TOWN


