Minutes

Meeting opened for public comment at 7:30 PM.

1) Public Comment: No public comments were received.

2) GIS Mapping Grant Status

Matthew Thorenz and Brian Chance presented an overview of the GIS Mapping project status gave a live demo of the mapping site that will be linked to the Town and Village HPC web pages. Matthew described his research in developing the material presented on the site which is expected to be completed by the end of June and installed by the end of July.

As requested by the Commission, icons used to define the various structures have been color coded to differentiate stone houses (red), brick (blue), designated landmarks (yellow) and wood frame, (green). In order to minimize map clutter, the properties built after 1930 will be indicated with a small 'x'. The application will include an easy to use interface that will allow editing of the data and updating with additional photos, narratives, and parcel views. A mechanism will be added to allow visitors to submit material for publication on the site.

A presentation to the Village HPC will be scheduled for July.
