Successful Community Potluck May 10th

We had our second annual community potluck and shared all the progress made in the past year. New Paltz Climate Smart Action Groups

We have changed the name of our “subcommittees” to “action groups” because that is what they are! Here is a list of our current action groups, their tasks and key contacts:

6 Rs - Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repair, Repurpose, Recycle. The order of the **Rs** is also important. This group is working on expanded recycling, food waste reduction, swaps, community education, etc. (Heidi Firstencel)

Green Business: Expand the number of businesses utilizing green business practices. This could be doing an energy retrofit, installing solar or other renewable energy, green procurement, etc. This group is also trying to assess what green businesses we want to attract to New Paltz, such as a zero waste store. Currently we have three high school students reaching out to all New Paltz restaurants. (interim leader Janelle Peotter)

Green Spaces: Habitat, Bee City, Edible Gardens, Tree Planting, pollinators plantings in public spaces (Liz Elkin)

Green Transportation: increasing safety & convenience of bicycling and walking in New Paltz, encouraging bicycle sharing, create new idling law, liaison with town bike/ped committee (interim leader Janelle Peotter)

Publicity, Social Media, Press Releases: Consciousness raising, Weekly Tips in paper (Jim Gordon & Victoria Hilton)

Youth: engagement, outreach, education, mentoring, coordinate projects with New Paltz Youth Program (interim leader Janelle Peotter)

Alternative Energy – Solar, Wind, implementing Community Choice Aggregation (Mark Varian)

Lifestyle – promoting a climate smart lifestyle, education, demonstrations (Orelle Feher)

Our CCA (Community Choice Aggregation) Committee has been getting deeper and deeper into all the details on the CCA. The more we learn, the better we understand how important this action is for creating the market demand for renewable energy. We are happy that both the Village and the Town of New Paltz have passed laws to allow us to form a CCA. We are hoping that the Mayor and Supervisor chose a CCA administrator in the coming weeks. This would put us on the path to start drawing our renewable energy through the Central Hudson grid by October.
