Public Input:

Ron Montesano, New Paltz, spoke in opposition of the proposed moratorium. He feels that it is unfair to the businesses that have spent money to develop their land.

At 7:30 p.m. a motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to open the Town Board meeting with the pledge. Seconded by Councilman Torres, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

<u>Agenda</u>: +Send letter to Federal Court, +Set Public Hearing for Rail Trail Bridge A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to adopt the agenda as amended. Seconded by Councilman Torres, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

Public Input:

Donna Bruschi spoke about her concerns regarding cycling in New Paltz, the lack of a crosswalk by ShopRite, the markings on Henry W. DuBois, and the lack of a shoulder on Route 32 North. Mike Reid, WVRTA, spoke about his concerns regarding the Rail Trail Bridge Project.

<u>Letter to Federal Court:</u>

Councilman Torres explained that a New Paltz resident, Joel Guerrero, who is here on a VISA, was recently detained by an ICE Officer in NYC and is facing possible deportation. His wife and family are asking that the Town Board write a letter to the Federal Court requesting that Mr. Guerrero not be deported, as it would be a detriment to his family.

A motion was made by Councilman Torres to pass the drafted letter and send it to the Federal Court House asking that Mr. Guerrero not be deported. Seconded by Councilman Irwin, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

Route 299 Gateway Moratorium Discussion:

Attorney Victoria Polidoro explained that the law has been revised to include most of the comments made by the Town and County Planning Boards. Attorney Polidoro answered and clarified questions that were asked by Councilman Irwin, about the process and the revised law. At 7:59 p.m. a motion was made by Councilman Torres to close the public hearing on the proposed moratorium. Seconded by Supervisor Bettez, all aye votes cast, Councilman Irwin abstained. Motion

Resolution-Support for Application:

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION – SUPPORT FOR AN APPLICATION TO THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION FOR THE 2016 ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLE AND INFRASTRUCTURE MUNICIPAL REBATE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of New Paltz seeks to promote a resilient, vibrant, and sustainable local economy that benefits its residents and local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board recognizes that the impacts of climate change pose threats to our community, and that the public welfare is best served by policies and programs that reduce dependence on fossil fuels and promote investments in clean energy infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the transportation sector accounts for nearly 45% of GHG emissions in the Mid-Hudson Region, according to the 2013 Mid-Hudson Regional Sustainability Plan, and promotion of electric vehicle ("EV") use must be an important component of the Town's efforts to address climate change and reduce GHG emissions; and

WHEREAS, the installation of a pubic EV charging station in the Community Center parking lot located at 3 Veteran's Drive would serve these planning priorities and objectives by bringing visitors to town and encouraging travel by foot to shops, restaurants and recreational and cultural amenities while vehicles are being charged; and

WHEREAS, an EV charging station in New Paltz's downtown would be within the typical EV driving range of New York City for the new generation of EV models and would help boost tourism; and

WHEREAS, the installation of a public EV charging station will also encourage adoption of electric vehicles by reducing "range anxiety" and by increasing public awareness of electric vehicles and their benefits, thereby contributing to the shift to clean vehicles locally and regionally; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) offers a rebate of \$8,000 per port for an EV charging station, covering 80% of the total project costs, including electricity for charging and networking fees/subscriptions for up to two years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of New Paltz desires to purchase and install a public EV charging station equipped with two ports, to be located on Town property in the Community Center parking lot at 3 Veteran's Drive; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board expresses its strong support for the application to the NYS DEC's 2016 Zero-Emission Vehicle and Infrastructure Municipal Rebate Program and commits to providing a minimum combined in-kind and financial contribution of 20 percent toward the match.

Seconded by Councilman Irwin, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

Vehicle Use Policy:

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to approve the following revised Vehicle Use Policy: **Schedule E**

Town of New Paltz Vehicle Use Policy

Municipal Vehicles may only be used for legitimate municipal business.

Copies of licenses must be on file with the Comptroller and the Town insurer, prior to the operation of a Town owned vehicle.

Individuals assigned a Municipal Vehicle with commuting privileges may make "incidental personal uses" such as stopping at a grocery store or going to the bank, on his/her way home, but only if the stop does not add mileage to the trip.

Operators should exercise sound judgment at all times when using assigned Municipal Vehicles and should avoid the appearance of misuse.

Municipal Vehicles will not be used to transport any individual who is not directly or indirectly related to municipal business. Unauthorized passengers are not allowed to ride in Town vehicles. Under no circumstances are non-town employees permitted to ride or drive in Town-owned vehicles. Passengers shall be limited to Town employees and individuals who are directly associated with Town work activity (committee members, consultants, contractors, etc.). Family members shall not be transported in Municipal Vehicles. Police Officers transporting individuals in the performance of their normal job duties are exempt from this provision.

The Town shall not be liable for the loss or damage of any personal property transported in the Municipal Vehicle or for any personal property while using their Personal Vehicle for work-related travel.

Unless expressly exempted by law, employees are to ensure that they and all passenger(s) in a Municipal Vehicle wear seat belts at all times, if the Municipal Vehicle is so equipped.

Employees may not operate Municipal Vehicles or Personal Vehicles being used for work-related travel under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs, or any controlled substances.

Employees are prohibited from possessing illegal drugs or controlled substances, except as prescribed by a doctor, in a Municipal Vehicle or in a Personal Vehicle being used for work-related travel (police officers who are required to carry prohibited items in performing their normal job duties are exempt).

Employees are expected to keep Municipal Vehicles clean and to report any malfunction, damage, needed repairs or other vehicle problems to their supervisor immediately.

Employees operating a Municipal Vehicle or a Personal Vehicle while on work-related travel shall obey all applicable traffic and parking regulations, ordinances, and laws.

Employees who incur parking or other fines/citations while operating or using an assigned Municipal Vehicle or using a Personal Vehicle on work-related travel, will be personally responsible for payment of such fines/citations. When an employee using a Municipal Vehicle or Personal Vehicle on work-related travel is involved in a motor vehicle accident, any person has been injured, or when vehicles have suffered damage, the Accident Notification Policy for Town of New Paltz Employees must be followed which includes calling the local or state police and filling out the Town

of New Paltz accident incident report.

Discipline: Failure to comply with any and all applicable provisions of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including suspension or removal of Town vehicle privileges, suspension and/or termination of employment.

Seconded by Councilman Irwin, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

At 8:17 p.m. Councilman Torres left the meeting.

Revised Mobilitie Cellular Request:

A motion was made by Councilman Irwin to decline the revised request made by Mobilitie for the installation of a cell site near Cherry Hill. Seconded by Supervisor Bettez, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

Credit Card and Open Charge Account Policy:

Tabled.

At 8:20 p.m. a motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to go into Executive Session for the purposes of discussing legal matters. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

At 8:36 p.m. a motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to come out of Executive Session. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to engage Attorney George Lithco, Planning Board Attorney, to begin the legal process to recover funds from Wilmorite/Park Point on a contingency basis, 20% plus out of pocket expenses. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to authorize the Supervisor to sign the Purchase Option Extension Agreement with David Roehrs, after a discussion with legal counsel and DEP. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to approve the salary increase for the Assessor by \$879/year. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.

A motion was made by Supervisor Bettez to pay for employee training for the Recycling Department. Seconded by Councilwoman Seyfert-Lillis, all aye votes cast, motion carried.
