**5. Mill Brook Preserve:** Seth McKee asked what was next to be done on the Mill Brook Preserve. The Town Board has accepted the Plan. Will they adopt the plan? Seth suggests starting by pricing out the creation of two access points with kiosks, basic simple trail upgrades with review of existing paths, a small bridge over the stream to get an idea how much money is needed to start. Culverts, trail materials and benches were mentioned. Brad Barclay uses benches on the Dutchess County Rail Trail that have been indestructable; he recommends them. Marty asked about the real estate transfer tax-- can it be changed to fund non-capital open space expenses? The thinking here is that it could fund the development and maintenance of a park preserve. In the ensuing discussion it appears that the tax can be approved on a town by town basis-- does not need to be county-wide. The Town of Red Hook got a 1% transfer tax on real estate transactions over the town's median price. Susan Zimet is interested in taking this up with the Town Board, which is wrestling with the budget now.
