#### June Climate Change Solutions *Meetup*: Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project in New Paltz

Our Climate Change Solutions Meetup normally meets on the first Tuesday of every month at 6:00 pm. We have been meeting for almost three years now and cover a wide range of topics. It happens that there is a virtual public information meeting this month on the following Tuesday on a topic that is very much a climate change solution: improving pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure. The Task Force therefore decided that this will be our Meetup this month! Here are the details: Alta Planning + Design invites you to attend the virtual public information meeting for the Henry W. Dubois Drive Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project (PIN 8762.48). This will be an opportunity for the project team to provide a progress update, present the preferred alternative, discuss design details, and address some of your comments and questions. The meeting will begin with a 20-minute presentation followed by a 45-minute workshop to discuss design details related to traffic calming, separation barrier, and landscaping, and will conclude with a 10-15-minute question and answer session. 

#### **Climate Smart Book Club: June Book Pick**



The June pick for our Climate Smart Book Club is *Under a White Sky: The Nature of the Future* by Elizabeth Kolbert. In this her latest book the author takes a hard look at the new world we are creating. While reading her book, we meet biologists who are trying to preserve the world's rarest fish, which lives in a single tiny pool in the middle of the Mojave; engineers who are turning carbon emissions to stone in Iceland; Australian researchers who are trying to develop a super coral that can survive on a hotter globe; and physicists who are contemplating shooting tiny diamonds into the stratosphere to cool the earth.

One way to look at human civilization, says Kolbert, is as a tenthousand-year exercise in defying nature. In her book *The Sixth Extinction*, she explored the ways in which our capacity for destruction

has reshaped the natural world. Now she examines how the very sorts of interventions that have imperiled our planet are increasingly seen as the only hope for its salvation. #### **Atypical Earth Day Fair, April 2021**

Since 2002 there has been an Earth Day Fair on the grounds of the Reformed Church of New Paltz. Then in 2020 Covid arrived and it was cancelled. So, this year the New Paltz Climate Action Coalition, the New Paltz Interfaith Earth Action and the Caring for Creation Committee of the Reformed Church decided that safety and caution came first so there would not be the typical Earth Day Fair. Determined to make lemonade out of lemons, instead there was an "Atypical Earth Day Fair Unbound."

An online series on You Tube channel, <u>bit.ly/earthdayunbound</u>, featured earth-conscious presenters (call it techno tabling!) offering a variety of environmental information and perspectives which you can still watch. In addition, community faith leaders offered caring for creation blessings from their varied traditions. Music was provided by former Earth Day Fair performers. There were memorial tributes to John Wackman and Dan Guenther, who were both such important parts of past Earth Day programs and such community champions for the environment.

As in the past, the flags of all the countries of the earth were flying over Huguenot Street - thank you Ann and Dan Guenther! Each country's environmental footprint was ranked with a green, yellow, orange or red sticker (lowest to highest) attached to their flagpole and included the number of per-capita tons of greenhouse gas they emit. The color coded stickers provided a short-hand way of comparing countries greenhouse gas emissions.
