Here is a brief outline of the various activities and accomplishments by the HPC over the past **two months** (there was no HPC meeting in August):

- John Orfitelli agreed to serve a co-chair with Cara Lee on the Campaign. Certain campaign related activities involved establishing a campaign checking account, maintaining financial records for contributions, working with the board of elections, and meeting with major sponsor/donors including the Trust for Public Lands, Scenic Hudson, and the Hudson valley Land Trust every two weeks to review status of our campaign activities.
- A <u>Facebook page was created for the Campaign</u> to promote the referendum and encourage feedback on Local Law No.1. The platform has been very successful in providing a way for the committee to address various questions regarding the impact of Local Law No.1. Susan DeMark continues to monitor both the HPC and Campaign pages to respond to questions and negative comments with clear and concise responses.
- A great deal of time has been spent by the Commission (and Susan in particular) at creating, reviewing, and editing campaign materials including post cards, flyers, signage, logos, and letters for publication. Here's a list of the materials provided by Matt Maley over the past two months:
