The meeting was called to order at 7:15pm with a motion from Matt Maley and seconded by Susan DeMark. Motion carried.

Minutes:

- 1. Public Comment: No public comments were received.
- 2. Partners in Preservation: The Commission was pleased to present Doree Lipson with a Partners in Preservation certificate recognizing her outstanding efforts and commitment to preserving the character of New Paltz by preventing the demolition of the property at xxx Main Street. Susan DeMark will be finalizing a press release for publication in Hudson Valley One that will highlight Doree's contribution.





3. Map Site Status: Dr Pham continues to implement the changes submitted by the Commission in October. Several e-mail exchanges have provided clarification and additional data by the Commission. John Orfitelli will be meeting with Dr Pham to review how to use the Admin Tool for making additions and changes to the property data. The target for public release is 1Q2024.

- 4. Community Outreach Update: Work continues on several items for Community Outreach including the Information Packet for 215 Huguenot Street., an Op Ed by Susan DeMark on how historic preservation can enhance sustainability and environmental conservation through efficient design and smart reuse, and additional Then and Now photos by Matt Maley for publication in HPC Facebook.
- 5. CPF for Historic Preservation: John Orfitelli has been working to determine a consistent, easily repeatable, and fair process for determining the valuation for a façade which would be used in support of a façade easement.

The most promising approach so far involves the use of a program by CoreLogic called SwiftEstimator. The program is currently used by insurance companies to establish the replacement value for various elements of a house including the roof, windows, exterior walls, etc. The technical representative at CoreLogic, Ed Martinez, has agreed to assist with the evaluation of the program for use by HPC.

The SwiftEstmator is very reasonably priced at \$24 per application. The data can be edited up to 24 hours before a report is created.

The next step is to approach a homeowner and obtain their concurrence to use their house measurements and related data to create a test case using the program. The results from the test case and process involving the SwiftEstimator program will serve as the basis for a façade easement valuation methodology to be assessed by Christine Chale for compliance with the CPF Law.


