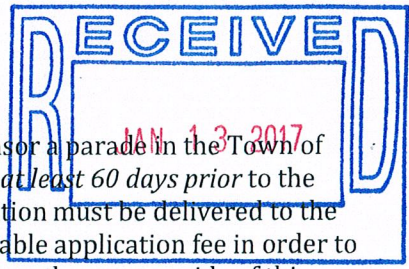

Parade Request Application

This form is to be used by any organization or group requesting permission to sponsor a parade in the Town of New Paltz, N.Y. ("Town"), and must be completed and submitted to the Town Clerk at least 60 days prior to the parade date. All steps of this application must be completed. The completed application must be delivered to the Town Clerk, 52 Clearwater Road, New Paltz, NY, together with a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee in order to begin processing the application. Please review the Parade Application Instructions on the reverse side of this application.

Step 2: (check ONE parade route only)

Place an (X) mark indicating your parade route choice. If you wish to propose an alternate parade route, check the box provided and fill-in the complete route. A final determination on which parade route will be permitted will be made by the Town Board. If parade is to be followed by an event at a Village or Town park, a separate Event use Application must be completed and submitted to either the Village Clerk or Town Clerk.

Parade Route One: Beginning in the New Paltz Middle School parking lot, proceed north on S. Manheim Blvd. to Main St. Proceed west on Main St. to Plattekill Ave. Proceed south on Plattekill Ave. to the Village of New Paltz Fire Dept./Village Hall. If you wish to extend your parade end-point to the entrance to Hasbrouck Park, check here . This does not grant you permission to use Hasbrouck Park. You must submit a separate "Event Use Application" to the Village Clerk.

Parade Route Two: Beginning on N. Manheim Blvd., proceed south to Main St. Proceed west on Main St. to Plattekill Ave. Proceed south on Plattekill Ave. to the Village of New Paltz Fire Dept./Village Hall. If you wish to extend your parade end-point to the entrance to Hasbrouck Park, check here . This does not grant you permission to use Hasbrouck Park. You must submit a separate "Event Use Application" to the Village Clerk.

Parade Route Three: Beginning on Plattekill Ave. by SUNY New Paltz Old Main Circle, proceed north on S. Oakwood Terrace to main St. Proceed west on Main St. to the alleyway/driveway next to Gourmet Pizza and turn south, proceed through the Plattekill Ave. municipal lot back onto Plattekill Ave. and returning south to the SUNY New Paltz Old Main Circle.

Parade Route Four: Beginning in the New Paltz Middle School parking lot, proceed south on S. Manheim Blvd. to Plattekill Ave., turn west to Hasbrouck Ave., turn left at intersection of Plattekill and Hasbrouck Aves. and proceed to Hasbrouck Park. This does not grant you permission to use Hasbrouck Park. You must submit a separate "Event Use Application" to the Village Clerk.

Spring Duathalon (Dual) Against Cystic Fibrosis

- Requesting permission to host a duathlon (run-bike-run) on Saturday May13, 2017. Race is insured by USA Triathlon and locally sponsored by the Reformed Church of New Paltz and Bike Depot. Race committee obtains insurance certificate and lists Reformed Church of New Paltz as Additional Insured and provides Town, Village and Church with copies of Insurance Certificate. Expected race size 100-150 people. No bigger than 150 people. (Last 2 years we had ~100 participants).
- Race transition area would be in parking lot of Reformed Church on Huguenot Street (lot next to church) and race start will be on Huguenot St in front of church.
- Run south on Huguenot Street, turn left at North Front Street, left onto rail trail going north. Continue on rail trail to Huguenot Street intersection, turn left onto Huguenot Street and return to transition area.
- Bike course would be from transition onto Huguenot Street, past Gilded Otter. Right turn onto 299, right turn onto Springtown Road (5 miles down and back). Turn around on Springtown Road at River Road intersection. Bike back to transition area. Chain link at "Y" intersection of Huguenot and North Front Street to be removed during race to allow for more space for bikes to pass through (permission for this obtained from Huguenot Street Historical Society).
- Repeat run course. Finish line in front of Reformed Church of New Paltz.
- A Kids Dual/Fun Run will take place after this event. This event will also be insured and run by volunteers. Kids Dual to run from front of Reformed Church to Mulberry St. to rail trail, pick up bikes from church education parking lot (by Twice Blessed), bike along Huguenot Street and back to Twice Blessed area, run through Dressel Field to rail trail, up Broadhead to end in front of Reformed Church. Adult volunteers to bike along with kids for entire 1 mile up Huguenot Street. This is the 3rd year of the Kids Dual and it has run smoothly every year as we have many volunteers on the course for safety.
- Bike and run courses are marked with spray chalk (environmentally safe, washes off in rain, does not permanently mark road). Playground chalk used on Huguenot Street instead of spray chalk. Cones used to mark lanes for runners and bikers for safety in area in front of church.
- Event is a fundraiser for The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation being sponsored by The Reformed Church of New Paltz and Bike Depot. 100% of profits of this race are donated to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.
- Volunteers direct people to park in Municipal lot on Huguenot Street, in Rail Trail lot, along Broadhead Street and in church Education Building parking lot. Owners of La Stazione to be contacted again this year for permission to use their lots for parking if needed. Participants will walk their bikes from parking lots to event start in front of church.
- Permission received from Reformed Church of New Paltz and will be received again from HHS.
- Volunteer or on duty police presence requested at intersection of Huguenot Street and 299 to slow traffic and possibly stop traffic briefly to allow for bikes to cross bridge. Also requesting a police officer be at Intersection of Springtown Road and 299 to slow or briefly stop traffic and allow for bikes to cross over on the way back from Springtown to Huguenot Street. ***All crossings and intersections will have volunteers present for safety.***
- Huguenot Street to be closed during race from Mulberry Street to Broadhead Street intersection. (Open to residents wishing to leave or get to their homes). Open from Broadhead Street to North Front Street. North Front Street open to traffic.
