Summary Description of the Intent of the

PROHIBITION ON ILLICIT DISCHARGES, ACTIVITIES AND CONNECTIONS TO SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS LAW

The proposed "PROHIBITION ON ILLICIT DISCHARGES, ACTIVITIES AND CONNECTIONS TO SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM", would add a new Chapter 136 to the Town Code for the purpose of regulating connections to, and controlling the introduction of pollutants into, the Separate Storm Sewer System of the Town of New Paltz in order to comply with the requirements of the NYS DEC SPDES General Permit for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (GP-0-15-003).

The intent of the local law is regulate discharges to the Town of New Paltz Municipal Storm Sewer System (MS4) and avoid the discharge of pollutants into the MS4 to the maximum extent practicable, as required by federal and state law, since such systems are not designed to accept, process or discharge non-stormwater waste. The law establishes methods for controlling the introduction of pollutants into the MS4, prohibits Illicit Connections, Activities and Discharges to the MS4, establishes legal authority to carry out all inspection, surveillance and monitoring procedures necessary to ensure compliance, and promotes public awareness of the hazards involved in the improper discharge of pollutants into the MS4.

The action is anticipated to have a beneficial impact on surface water and groundwater resources by eliminating or reducing the discharge of pollutants into the MS4. No adverse environmental impacts are anticipated.
