#### CLG Grant Awarded to the Town of New Paltz Historic Preservation Commission by the State Historic Preservation Office

Engage with the owners of Stone Houses for the purpose of Designating their property as a Local Historic Landmark

**Candidate Properties Include** 

Nine already documented in previous intensive-level surveys Plus six properties from our Inventory Survey.

## **Local Historic Landmark Designation**

#### **Selection Criteria for Properties**

- Possess special character, historic or aesthetic interest, or value as part of the culture, political, economic, or social history of the locality, region, state, or nation.
- Identified with historic personages.
- Embody distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style.
- Work of a designer who has significantly influenced an age.
- Represents an established visual feature of the neighborhood due to a singular physical characteristic or unique location.

All of the Stone Houses in New Paltz meet one or more of these criteria.

# **Local Historic Landmark Designation Process**

## 1. Nomination Package

- Applicant Information
- Basic Property Information
- Site Description
- Discussion of Historic Significance
- 2. Notifications and Public Hearing Review
- 3. Decision by the Commission

#### **Based on Three Underlying Principles**

- Historic properties shall be retained with their historic features altered as little as possible.
- 2. Any alteration of existing property shall be **compatible with its historic character,** and with the historic character of surrounding properties.
- 3. New construction shall be **compatible with the historic character of its surroundings.**

#### **Criteria for Approval**

#### **Factors Under Consideration**

- 1. The general design, character and appropriateness to the property
- **2. The scale** in relation to the property itself, surrounding properties and the neighborhood;
- **3. Texture, materials, and color** and their relation to similar features of other properties in the neighborhood;
- 4. Visual compatibility with surrounding properties, including
  - Proportion of the property's front façade
  - Proportion and arrangement of windows and other openings within the façade
  - Roof shape
  - Rhythm of spacing of properties on streets, including setback
- **5.** The importance of historic, architectural or other features to the significance of the property.

- Home Owner Provides Basic Description of Changes
- Additional Materials as available include:
  - Photographs of the property
  - Scaled site plan or survey of the property
  - Scaled elevation drawing of proposed changes
  - Scaled perspective drawing of proposed changes
  - Samples of color and/or materials to be used
  - If the proposal includes a sign or lettering:
    - Scaled drawing showing type of lettering used
    - All dimensions and colors
    - Description of materials to be used
    - Method of illumination
    - Site Plan showing sign's location on the property

#### **Review Process**

- Public Hearing Scheduled: Commission meets on the third Wednesday of each month.
- **Home Owner (or agent) Notified** of the Public Hearing date and time.
  - Legal Notice Published in New Paltz Times
  - Meeting Published on HPC Web Site
  - Application made available at Town Clerk's Office
  - Abutter Notifications Sent by Postal Mail
  - Sign Posted on Property
- Home Owner (or agent) addresses any questions or concerns that the Commission may have.
  - Additional information may be requested.
- Commission issues a written decision on the application.
  - Copy mailed to the applicant (or agent).
  - Recorded by Town Clerk.
