### **JOINT BUSINESS AGENDA**

#### 1. Climate, Equity, and Justice Related Items and Updates

- a. Police Reform Update (7:10pm Jennifer Berry)
  - i. NPPRRC Report
  - ii. Report is complete! There are a few sections that were intentionally left blank and there will be community feedback on what else could be included
  - iii. It would be helpful to know that the Town and Village boards have reviewed the report prior to the town hall that will be held with the public
  - iv. New Paltz could be a model community for implementing these changes county wide and potentially state wide

## 2. County Discussion Items (7:20pm Eve Walter & Jim Deluane)

- a. County is looking at implementing a pilot program for Universal Basic Income
  - i. This has been problematic from the start and is being reworked
- b. Tech City has received many applications for use
- c. What kinds of expectations should we have for programs that are receiving funding from the County Legislature?
  - i. Serving underserved or disadvantaged communities
- d. Donaldson's proposed tax appears to be dead in the water

# 3. Drinking Water Source Protection Program Presentation (7:30pm Chana Friedenberg)

- a. Stakeholder group has been meeting monthly since fall of 2020
- b. Process has been to identify watershed areas
- c. Once the areas were identified, potential contaminants were then identified
- d. The next step will be to create protection methods to mitigate potential contaminants and implement those methods

# 4. Discussion on the proposed New Paltz Apartments & possible annexation (8:05pm Will Frank, Rick Golden, Mike Moriello, John Litton)

- a. SEQRA process needs to happen prior to any possible annexation
- b. NP Apts Overview
  - i. There is no PILOT requested or any reduction in taxes
  - ii. Meeting with residents of Hawk Hill to get feedback on the potential project
    - 1. They did not want a through road and requested a fence between the apartment complex and the subdivision
  - iii. Connectivity is important bike and pedestrian paths
    - 1. Includes a proposed public trail system as well as a path to SUNY
  - iv. Stormwater management would be on the west side along with buffering
    - 1. Wooded areas would remain on the west side
  - v. Main traffic circle with club house, common areas, mail room, would sit 25 to 30 feet below Rt 32
  - vi. Cottage style project 2 story structures, 250 units
- c. Contribution to municipal sewer system
  - i. Expansion tank or equalization basin
  - ii. Potential for this addition to be on the NP Apts property rather than the Village wastewater treatment plant property
- d. Green building elements are important and will be incorporated
- e. Village board and Town board would like the Planning Board to be the lead agency for the SEQRA process
- f. Public hearing for annexation should take place after SEQRA is completed
- g. Environmental Policy Board would be an interested agency, not an involved agency, and will have opportunity to weigh in on the scoping process
- h. Regarding publication of documents and on websites
  - i. The village and town websites can have a link to a website that contains all the documents
  - ii. The village has the capacity to house these documents in our google drive and on our website
- i. Next steps
  - i. March 16th Village Planning Board meeting will have a presentation
  - ii. The project will be declared a Type I
  - iii. The PB will circulate their intent to be the lead agency
  - iv. After a 30 day period, they will assume the role of lead agency

# 5. Pollinator garden at the Town Community Center with murals/signage (8:45pm Amanda Gotto)

a. High school's Climate Club is participating in the planning

- b. Name of the garden will be Pollinator Paradise
- c. Community Foundation will manage the fundraising efforts
  - i. Budget is around \$3,000
- d. Request for village and town to post about this on their websites
- e. This is phase 1 of the pollinator project
- f. Native plants will be planted
- g. Maintenance of the garden will be handled by the volunteers who are establishing the garden and will also be managing the compost bins not asking for maintenance from the town or village staff
